BY-LAW NO. 834.

A BY-LAW FOR THE REGULATION OF THE USE OF BICYCLES ON PUBLIC THOROUGHFARES IN THE CITY OF TRAIL.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and necessary to regulate the use of bicycles on public thoroughfares in the City of Trail.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the City of Trail in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:-

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride any bicycle upon the sidewalk of any street in the City of Trail.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride any bicycle upon any street in the City of Trail in the manner commonly known as "coasting" or in any other manner in which the rider of such bicycle shall not have absolute control thereof so that he may immediately stop the same to avoid all possible injury or collision.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride bicycles in any street more than two abreast.
4. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride any bicycle without having attached thereto a bell, gong, horn or whistle, in good working order, and sufficient to give plainly audible warning of the approach thereof, or to fail or neglect to sound the same when approaching any vehicle, horse or other animal, or pedestrian, or upon approaching any place where any person may be entering or leaving any conveyance, or upon approaching any street intersection, or before passing around any corner.
5. An annual tax of Fifty cents (50¢) is hereby imposed on each bicycle used in the Municipality of the City of Trail, and such tax shall be payable on the first day of January in each year to the City Treasurer at his office at the City Hall at the corner of Line Avenue and Spokane Street in the City of Trail aforesaid.
6. A licence plate shall be attached to the rear mud guard of each bicycle, which said licence plate may be obtained from the City Hall upon payment of the annual tax aforesaid.
7. Any person or persons guilty of an infraction of any part or portion of this By-law for which no penalty is heretofore imposed, or noncompliance with any of the provisions or requirements hereof,

shall, upon coming before the Police Magistrate of the City of Trail or any Justice or Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction in the said City, on the oath or affirmation of any credible witness, forfeit and pay at the discretion of the Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices of the Peace convicting, a penalty not exceeding \$100.00 and costs of prosecution of such offence, and in default of payment thereof it shall be lawful for such Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices of the Peace convicting aforesaid, to issue a warrant over his hand and seal, or in case the said Police Magistrate, Justice or Justices of the Peace or any two or more of them acting together therein, then under the hand and seal of one of them to levy the said penalty with costs or penalty or costs only by distress and sale of the offender's or offenders' goods and chattels and in case of not sufficient distress to satisfy the penalty it shall be lawful for the said Magistrate, Justices convicting aforesaid or any of them to commit the offender or offenders to the common gaol or lock-up house in the City of Trail for any period not exceeding thirty days with or without hard labor, unless such fine, penalty and costs, including the costs of the committal and the conveyance to the common gaol or lock-up house are sooner paid.

8. This Bylaw shall be known and cited for all purposes as "The City of Trail Bicycle Regulation Bylaw".

9. This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon registration thereof.
